Dear Friends,

This year we are celebrating the 16th year of the LPS Education Foundation. Since its inception in 2004, the Foundation has been proud to support the students, parents, and staff of Livonia Public Schools.

What began as a typical year, changed last spring as the COVID-19 pandemic impacted our LPS community. However, with the continued support of our corporate and individual donors, and the commitment of our Board of Directors and committee members, we were able to continue our Competitive Edge College Savings and Grant Programs. As a response to the changing needs of students as our district went to a virtual platform, we initiated a new program called *Bridging the Gap: Conquering the Digital Divide* which helped students gain access to the internet and ensure access to online learning for the reminder of the year. Because of the generosity of our community, the initiative raised \$19,580.85 from 93 donors. We are so grateful for this support.

This year marked the first distribution of Competitive Edge College Savings Program monies to students who enrolled in the program in 2008. Each verified enrollee received \$220.00 toward an approved college or skills training program. This distribution was a very proud moment for the Foundation

Additionally, our Grant Program allowed staff the opportunity to apply for grants that support the curriculum and other initiatives in the district. We awarded 23 grant proposals for \$28,937.53 this year. The work of the staff and the application of the grants truly benefit the students and district.

We look forward to resuming life that we knew before the pandemic. In the meantime, we will continue to support our programs, work with the school district staff to address and meet changing needs, and continue to fulfill the mission and core values of the Foundation.

History of the LPS Education Foundation

Nearly two decades ago, the financial situation of the Livonia Public Schools was radically different than today. At that time, the district was experiencing increasing enrollments, the state and national economy were robust, and the negative impact of an economic downturn was yet to be felt.

In 1997, the Board of Education commissioned a feasibility study to be conducted regarding the establishment of a school district foundation. Neighboring school district foundations were surveyed, research was gathered and analyzed, and consultants provided advice. After reviewing the results, the Board of Education decided against establishing a foundation at that time.

In late 2002, a follow-up study was conducted, at which time conditions had changed drastically and the need for an independent funding source that might aid the district was seen as both feasible and necessary. The following year, events were set in motion that resulted in the formalization of the Livonia Public Schools Education Foundation in early 2004.

First, all the documents required to legally establish a foundation needed to be written and submitted, including Articles of Incorporation, By-Laws, application for 501(c)3 status with the IRS, and other legal documents.

Next, a Board of Directors was selected and agreed to serve. The officers were elected for positions of President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Board members developed a mission statement, guiding principles, core values, goals and objectives, logo design, an information dissemination process, fund-raising strategies, and a host of other necessary tasks.

We have joined a national movement that is growing every year. According to the National School Foundation Association in 2019, giving to education foundations is estimated to have increased 2.5% to \$53.51 billion, the second largest recipient category (behind religion) of philanthropic donations in the U.S. It is projected there will be an intergenerational wealth transfer occurring over the next 25-35 years, yielding between 15 and 40 trillion dollars. Giving USA reports that many major donors who give to education are switching their financial support and focus from college and universities to elementary and secondary schools, and are finding educational foundations an excellent way to do that.

Commencing in Fiscal Year 2008, the Foundation initiated The Competitive Edge College Savings Program, which encouraged parents of new first graders to establish a college savings (529) plan. Starting in 2010, due to the overwhelming response from parents who are anxious to set up a college savings plan for their children at an early time, the Foundation offered the Competitive Edge program beginning with students who enter kindergarten. The Foundation provided an initial amount in a holding account for each kindergarten student whose parents registered for the program during this fiscal year.

With these facts in mind, and the firm belief that our teachers and administrators are committed to providing a high quality education for our community's children, we believe the growth and development of the Livonia Public Schools Education Foundation will play a vital role in the continued excellent educational experience offered to the Livonia Public Schools students.

We have a dedicated and talented Board of Directors, energetic and hard-working volunteers, and great partnerships with the business community. However, we have much to do.

We are grateful to all who have contributed time or money to the Foundation this year. We are optimistic about the future, and ask you to join us in teaming together to ensure learning for all.

Milestones celebrated at 10th annual LPS Education Foundation luncheon

The LPS Education Foundation celebrated milestones during its recent fund-raising luncheon event held at St. Mary's Cultural and Banquet Center in Livonia. A major fund-raiser for the LPS Education Foundation's Competitive Edge College Savings Program, the luncheon hosted more than 200 guests from around the community.

"Today, we can pause to reflect on longevity; on commitment; on community and count ourselves fortunate to enjoy the support that the LPS Education Foundation provides to our schools and also the support that is consistently shown to the Foundation by our community," said Livonia Public Schools Superintendent Andrea Oquist.

Foundation President Lorna Durand offered an update on the Competitive Edge College Savings Program, which provides LPS kindergarten students with the opportunity to sign up for a free account, to which the Foundation makes a donation. The program has approximately 3,000 students enrolled, who will receive a check upon graduating from LPS.

"This spring, we will be issuing checks to our first graduating cohort group. We are extremely excited," said Durand.

The other main program of the LPS Education Foundation is the Grant Program. During the first six years of this program, the Foundation has awarded 107 grants totaling approximately \$214,000. The grants help to support classrooms, the curriculum and the Shared Vision of the school district.

"We continue to be very supportive of the educational needs of our students, staff and families in our community," said Durand. "We appreciate the support of the community and we especially appreciate and value your support by being here today. We are very thankful for the generous financial support of our corporate donors and community members – you are the key to our success and we thank you."



Guests of the luncheon not only learned the latest news from the Foundation, but they also learned some "fun facts" about one of the state's most popular tourist destinations.

Bill Parlberg (pictured), President and Chief Operating Officer of the iconic Zehnder's of Frankenmuth, served up a behind-the-scenes look at the 1,500-seat restaurant that is known for its chicken dinners. Serving nearly 1 million meals per year, Zehnder's of Frankenmuth employs more than 900 staff and operates on the motto, "Every Guest Leaves Satisfied"

Parlberg, who began his career at Zehnder's as a dishwasher while he was in high school, now oversees the operation of the famed restaurant as well as the Splash Village Hotel and Waterpark, the Fortress 18-hole golf course and the Zehnder's retail division. Parlberg serves as chairman of the Michigan Travel Commission and was instrumental in bringing forth the Pure Michigan marketing campaign.

WJR sports radio personality and Livonia resident Steve Courtney once again served as the emcee of the Foundation luncheon. He was honored by the Foundation for his long-term commitment to this event, having served as its emcee for the past 10 years. Father George Shalhoub, of the Basilica of St. Mary Orthodox Church was also recognized for hosting the luncheon for each of the past 10 years.

Competitive Edge College Savings Program

The goal of the Livonia Public Schools Education Foundation is to provide a unique opportunity for LPS parents to begin planning for their children's post-secondary education early on, and help set aside money for their future educational expenses.

The Competitive Edge Savings Program, which was established in 2007, offers families of LPS kindergarten students the opportunity to enroll in this free program. The Foundation will designate them as beneficiaries of the Foundation's educational savings account. The Foundation contributes seed money and those funds grow throughout the child's LPS educational career. Upon graduation from LPS, the funds may be used for any post-secondary education or skills training program.

Not only does this program provide a great service to LPS students and their families, the Foundation also sees this as an added benefit to attract and retain families in the community. This unique program can help maintain the vibrance of our community and consequently, each family it attracts brings state funding to the school district, meeting the foundation's mission "to enlarge the resources available to the school district which will foster and expand educational opportunities."

It truly can provide a "competitive edge" over our surrounding communities.

Grant program continues to support schools

The LPS Educational Foundation Grant Program is in its seventh year and has distributed 130 grants totaling \$243,150 to LPS staff, schools, and departments. Each year staff is invited to apply for a Foundation grant. Their proposals demonstrate how the grant would support the district curriculum, the LPS Shared Vision and Collective Commitments, district climate goals, and other focus areas. The Grant Program is able to fund a special project, equipment or other needs that may be outside the district's budget.

A committee composed of retired teachers and administrators reviews the applications and selects which proposals will be funded. During the 2019-20 school year, the committee made surprise visits to 30 staff members with over-sized checks in hand.

"This is a wonderful gift from the Foundation that we are very proud of," said LPS Foundation president, Lorna Durand. Grants are funded by staff, individuals, community, and corporate donations.

A district Champion Program was created to act as a liaison for the LPS education program with each building and/or department. Each Champion is to share information regarding the Foundation's activities such as the Grant Program, the Competitive Edge Program, the Back-to-School activity, the Foundation's Annual Luncheon, and other activities. The Champions Program has helped to generate and maintain financial support for the Grant Program.
